### **CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES**

- City Council Returns to Virtual Meetings At the July 20, 2021 meeting, City Council gave direction that future City Council meetings will be held virtually on Zoom and the public can provide public comments virtually in recognition of the recently enacted County face covering mandate for all indoor activities. County offers vaccines at many different sites across the county to make it as easy as possible for eligible L.A. County residents to get vaccinated. You can obtain vaccines at County-run sites, all the LA City-run sites, almost all mobile sites, and many community sites do not require an appointment. - County Requires Masks Indoors Regardless of Vaccination Status Until further notice, the
  Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (DPH) has modified the <u>Health Officer Order</u> to
  require universal masking while indoors, regardless of vaccination status. People who are not
  vaccinated are at the highest risk of getting infected with COVID-19. Unvaccinated adults who
  are older or who have certain medical conditions are at highest risk of severe COVID-19 disease.
  To reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection:
  - o Get Vaccinated. It is the best way to protect against COVID-19.
  - Wear a mask that fits. Your mask is one of the most powerful tools you have to protect yourself and others.
  - o Avoid crowded places. Being in crowds, especially indoors, puts you at a higher risk.
  - Wash your hands and/or use hand sanitizer often especially after being in public spaces where surfaces are touched by many people. Avoid eating and touching your face with unwashed hands.
  - Stay home when sick. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, talk to a doctor and get a test, even if you are fully vaccinated. You should stay home and away from others until you get the result of your COVID-19 test or until your provider tells you that you don't have COVID-19.

In Los Angeles County, everyone 2 years of age and older must wear a mask in all indoor public places, regardless of their vaccination status. Everyone, regardless of vaccination status, must continue to wear a mask on all public transit and transit hubs, at all health care settings, correctional facilities, shelters and cooling centers, and schools and day care facilities. For masks to work properly, they need to completely cover your nose and mouth and fit snugly against the sides of your face and around your nose

L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 - Public Health is reporting 15 new deaths and 2,067 new cases of COVID-19. Case rates are increasing across all adult age groups with the highest case rate increases occurring in adults between the ages of 18 and 29 years old with a nine-fold increase, from 40 to 350 cases per 100,000 over the course of the past month. And case rates have increased 7.5-fold among 30-to-49 year-olds, from 33 to 247 cases per 100,000. There are 825 people with COVID -19 currently hospitalized. An increase in hospitalizations typically occurs two to three weeks after cases increase. Currently, 0.21% of positive cases are hospitalized; this is much lower than the 5.76% of cases hospitalized during the winter surge. To date, Public Health has identified 1,287,831 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 24,643 deaths. Testing results are available for over 7,270,000 individuals with 16% of people testing positive. Today's daily test positivity rate is 5.7%. Of the new deaths reported today, five people that passed away were over the age of 80, three people that passed away are between the ages of 65 and 79 years old, four people who passed away were between the ages of 50 and 64 years old and two people who died were between the ages of 30 and 49 years old.
