# **COVID-19 Situation Report**

### **CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES**

- City Council Returns to Virtual Meetings At the July 20, 2021 meeting, City Council gave direction that future City Council meetings will be held virtually on Zoom and the public can provide public comments virtually in recognition of the recently enacted County face covering mandate for all indoor activities. - Checking out Books and Vaccines at the L.A. County Libraries L.A. County Library is
  partnering with the L.A. County Department of Public Health to offer COVID-19 vaccine clinics for
  every 12 years and over at 13 community libraries on select dates through August 4. The vaccines

- Our Shot to End the Pandemic Reported by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the United States is once again seeing a rise in COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths. As of July 22, 35% of U.S. counties are experiencing high levels of community transmission. COVID-19 cases are on the rise in nearly 90% of U.S. jurisdictions, and we are seeing outbreaks in parts of the country that have low vaccination coverage. These worrisome trends are due, in part, to the rapid spread of the highly transmissible B.1.617.2 (Delta) variant. An increase in the number of cases will put more strain on healthcare resources and could lead to more hospitalizations and deaths. To reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection:
  - o Get Vaccinated. It is the best way to protect against COVID-19.
  - Wear a mask that fits. Your mask is one of the most powerful tools you have to protect yourself and others.
  - o Avoid crowded places. Being in crowds, especially indoors, puts you at a higher risk.
  - Wash your hands and/or use hand sanitizer often especially after being in public spaces where surfaces are touched by many people. Avoid eating and touching your face with unwashed hands.
  - Stay home when sick. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, talk to a doctor and get a
    test, even if you are fully vaccinated. You should stay home and away from others
    until you get the result of your COVID-19 test or until your provider tells you that you
    don't have COVID-19.
- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) is reporting 3,248 new cases of COVID-19, a 17% increase over last week. The daily average case rate is now 15.7 cases per 100,000 people, an increase of 21.7% from last week's rate of 12.9 cases per 100,000 people. This is a significantly smaller rate of increase than seen last week, where cases increased over 80% from the prior week. To date, Public Health has identified 1,293,450 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 24,675 deaths. Of the 17 new deaths reported today, four people that passed

away were over the age of 80, three people that passed away were between the ages of 65 and 79 years old, and 10 people who passed away were between the ages of 50 and 64 years old. Testing results are available for nearly 7,300,000 individuals with 16% of people testing positive. Today's daily test positivity rate is 5.17%, an increase of less than half a percentage point (0.44) from last week's rate of 4.73%, which was itself an increase of nearly a full percentage point over the previous week. This also suggests that our rate of increase may be stabilizing.
