CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Take the Beach Cities Health District Community Health Survey Beach Cities Health District (BCHD) is asking residents of Manhattan Beach to take its Community Health Survey to better understand local health needs. Residents are encouraged to fill out the survey to ensure their health needs to be taken into consideration when BCHD determines its health priorities. The last day to complete the survey is Monday, August 30 and the survey takes 20 minutes to complete. Upon completion, you will have the option to enter an opportunity drawing for a chance to win two tickets to the Beach Life Festival or gift cards to Blue Zones Project Approved restaurants. - Our Shot to End the Pandemic Reported by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the United States is once again seeing a rise in COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths. As of July 22, 35% of U.S. counties are experiencing high levels of community transmission. COVID-19 cases are on the rise in nearly 90% of U.S. jurisdictions, and we are seeing outbreaks in parts of the country that have low vaccination coverage. These worrisome trends are due, in part, to the rapid spread of the highly transmissible B.1.617.2 (Delta) variant. An increase in the number of cases will put more strain on healthcare resources and could lead to more hospitalizations and deaths. To reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection:
 - o Get Vaccinated. It is the best way to protect against COVID-19.
 - Wear a mask that fits. Your mask is one of the most powerful tools you have to protect yourself and others.
 - o Avoid crowded places. Being in crowds, especially indoors, puts you at a higher risk.
 - Wash your hands and/or use hand sanitizer often especially after being in public spaces where surfaces are touched by many people. Avoid eating and touching your face with unwashed hands.
 - Stay home when sick. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, talk to a doctor and get a test, even if you are fully vaccinated. You should stay home and away from others until you get the result of your COVID-19 test or until your provider tells you that you don't have COVID-19.
- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) confirms 2,293 new cases of COVID-19. Of the 20 new deaths

reported today, five people who passed away were over the age of 80, six people who passed were between the ages of 65 and 79, six people who passed were between the ages of 50 and 64, and three people who passed were between the ages of 30 and 49. To date, Public Health identified 1,307,970 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 24,704 deaths. Testing results are available for more than 7,358,000 individuals with 17% of people testing positive. Today's test positivity rate is 6.6%. There are 1,138 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized and 22% of these people are in the ICU. This is an increase of 313 daily hospitalizations since last Tuesday.
