CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Safer Together, Get Your Free Vaccine Still need to get your COVID-19 vaccine? Getting the vaccine means moving towards a new, better, safer normal for you, your kids, and your community. And it has never been easier to get! Anyone 12 and older living or working in L.A. County can get vaccinated against COVID-19. Vaccinations are widely available throughout L.A. County and many sites are open on weekends and have evening hours. Vaccinations are always free and open to eligible residents. The best way to fight the pandemic is to get vaccinated, wear a mask that fits, avoid crowded places, wash your hands and use hand sanitizer often, and stay home when sick.
- Take the Beach Cities Health District Community Health Survey Beach Cities Health District (BCHD) is asking residents of Manhattan Beach to take its Community Health Survey to better understand local health needs. Residents are encouraged to fill out the survey to ensure their health needs to be taken into consideration when BCHD determines its health priorities. The last day to complete the survey is Monday, August 30 and the survey takes 20 minutes to complete. Upon completion, you will have the option to enter an opportunity drawing for a chance to win two tickets to the Beach Life Festival or gift cards to Blue Zones Project Approved restaurants. - L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) confirms 19 new deaths and 3,672 new cases of COVID-19. To date, Public Health has identified 1,315,313 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 24,739 deaths. Of the 19 new deaths reported today, three people who passed away were over the age of 80, three people who died were between the ages of 65 and 79, six people who died were between the ages of 50 and 64, three people who died were between the ages of 30 and 49, and one person who died was between the ages of 18 and 29. Two deaths were reported by the City of Long Beach and one death was reported by the City of Pasadena. There are 1,279 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized; an increase of 361 people over the past week. Testing results are available for nearly 7,410,000 individuals with 17% of people testing positive. Today's test positivity rate is 4.7%; a decrease of more than a full
