COVID-19 Situation Report

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Domain Change By end of day on August 12, the City will migrate the existing www.citymb.info domain to www.manhattanbeach.gov. The .gov extension aligns with government best practices and assures the online community of the website legitimacy. The use of .gov is exclusive to US government agencies and overseen by the Federal General Services Administration (GSA). The change will impact the City's website URL, which will now be www.manhattanbeach.gov, and City email accounts will change to username@manhattanbeach.gov. During the domain transition, individuals who visit the www.citymb.info website will be automatically redirected to www.manhattanbeach.gov and email messages sent to a recipient's old email address will be forwarded to their new one.
- Safer Together, Get Your Free Vaccine Still need to get your COVID-19 vaccine? Getting the vaccine means moving towards a new, better, safer normal for you, your kids, and your community. And it has never been easier to get! Anyone 12 and older living or working in L.A. County can get vaccinated against COVID-19. Vaccinations are widely available throughout L.A. County and many sites are open on weekends and have evening hours. Vaccinations are always free and open to eligible residents. The best way to fight the pandemic is to get vaccinated, wear a mask that fits, avoid crowded places, wash your hands and use hand sanitizer often, and stay home when sick.
- Take the Beach Cities Health District Community Health Survey Beach Cities Health District (BCHD) is asking residents of Manhattan Beach to take its Community Health Survey to better understand local health needs. Residents are encouraged to fill out the survey to ensure their health needs are taken into consideration when BCHD determines its health priorities. The last day to complete the survey is Monday, August 30 and the survey takes 20 minutes to complete. Upon completion, you will have the option to enter an opportunity drawing for a chance to win two tickets to the Beach Life Festival or gift cards to Blue Zones Project Approved restaurants. Winners will be selected after the survey closes and notified by Friday, September 3. For more information, visit bchd.org.
- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) confirms 23 new deaths and 3,865 new cases of COVID-19. Of the 23 new deaths reported today, six people who passed away were over the age of 80, seven people who died were between the ages of 65 and 79, seven people who died were between the ages of 50 and 64, and two people who died were between the ages of 30 and 49. One death was reported by the City of Long Beach. To date, Public Health identified 1,339,138 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 24,854 deaths. Testing results are available for nearly 7,600,000 individuals with 16% of people testing positive. Today's test

positivity rate is 4.5%, a slight decrease from last week's same-day rate of 4.7%. As schools and institutes of higher education return to session and their routine testing programs come back online, we expect to see hundreds of thousands more test results each week and in parallel with those, increases in cases. There are 1,648 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized and 22% of these people are in the ICU. Comparing August 4 with July 4, hospitalizations rose by 366%.
