# COVID-19 Situation Report

AUGUST 17, 2021

## CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- **Mask Mandate for Outdoor Mega Events** – In an effort to slow the increasing trend in the level of transmission of COVID-19, beginning at 11:59p.m. on Thursday, August 19, L.A. County Department of Public Health will require that all persons at an “Outdoor Mega Event” wear a face mask, regardless of vaccination status, except when actively eating or drinking. The updated [Health Officer Order](#) states that when not actively eating or drinking, the face mask is immediately to be put back on. L.A. County considers an “Outdoor Mega Event” to be one where there are 10,000 or more people at one location. The City of Manhattan Beach and Association of Volleyball Professionals (AVP) will be hosting the 2021 MBO Beach Volleyball tournament from August 20 – 22 and will require that all attendees of the outdoor event wear face masks.
- **Manhattan Beach Residents are 83% Vaccinated** – 26,549 (83%) of Manhattan Beach residents, aged 12 years and up have received a COVID-19 vaccination as of August 12, 2021. L.A. County Department of Public Health has reported 2,679 residents aged 12 – 17 years and 23,870 residents aged 18 and older have received at least one dose of the vaccine. - **All In: Schools L.A. County Can Count On** – The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LACDPH) and the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE) are committed to the safety and well-being of L.A. County's 2 million students and their families as they begin the new school year. The ALL IN program, Funded by a \$266 million award from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), is a program that supports the safe reopening of schools by providing testing resources to over 80 school districts and more than 300 charter schools in Los Angeles County. - **L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19** – The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) confirms 30 new deaths and 2,907 new cases of COVID-19. Case numbers may be lower today due to reporting issues. Of the 30 new deaths reported today, six people who passed away were over the age of 80, five people who died were between the ages of 65 and 79, 10 people who died were between the ages of 50 and 64, seven people who died were between the ages of 30 and 49, and one person who died was between the ages of 18 and 29. One death was reported by the City of Long Beach. To date, Public Health identified 1,355,698 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 24,935 deaths. There are 1,679 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized and 24% of these people are in the ICU. Testing results are available for nearly 7,800,000 individuals with 16% of people testing positive.
