# **COVID-19 Situation Report**

SEPTEMBER 2, 2021

## CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Plan Having a plan for your household can make all the difference when facing an emergency. This National Preparedness Month, think about alert systems, evacuation routes, meeting places, sheltering, and how members of your household will communicate with each other when making or reviewing your family or business emergency plan. Remember to account for special considerations as well: Do you have family members that have a disability? Do you have pets? Will your family likely be spread apart when disasters strike? You will know your family's needs best. And make sure to practice so the first time you try your plan is not during an actual emergency.
- Case Rates Increased Among Children Ages 5 to 11 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) reports case rates have been increasing most rapidly among children 5 to 11, who are not eligible for vaccination. Between August 14 and August 21, the case rate increased 50% among children 5 to 11, while the rate increased 13% in children 0 to 4 years old, and 24% in children 12 to 17 years old. Over the last week, as the case rate dropped 2-4% in the oldest and youngest age groups, the rate continued to rise 9% among 5 to 11 year olds. With increased numbers of children not yet vaccinated back in schools, layered protections are essential.
- Health Officer Order Updates The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has
  issued an updated Health Officer Order for youth sports leagues and Mega Events.
  The update for youth sports leagues, which went into effect Wednesday, September 1, 2021,
  includes the following:
  - Youth sports leagues must follow the LA County <u>Health Officer Order</u> and the <u>LA County</u>
     <u>COVID19 Exposure Management Plan Guidance for Youth Recreational Sports Programs.</u>
  - Youth sports leagues that employ coaches or other support staff must also adhere to the Cal/OSHA <u>COVID-19 Prevention Emergency Temporary Standards</u> (ETS).
  - o Youth sports leagues operating concession stands should review and follow <u>DPH Best</u> <u>Practice Guidance for Food and Beverage Service</u>.
  - Participants: When indoors, require all participants, regardless of vaccination status, to bring and wear masks. Youth sports participants must wear a face mask even while engaging in physical activity in any indoor setting.
  - Spectators: When indoors, require all spectators, regardless of vaccination status, to bring and wear masks. Make masks available for those who arrive without them.

- Coaches: When indoors, require all coaches, regardless of vaccination status, to bring and wear masks when they are indoors. Coaches must wear masks even when engaged in intense physical activity when indoors.
- When outdoors, masks are recommended in crowded spaces and places, including among spectators at sporting events where distancing is not practical or possible. At sporting events attended by more than 10,000 individuals, universal masking is required by all spectators and employees except for the limited time when eating or drinking.
- Changes to COVID-19 Notifications In an effort to find a balanced approach to disseminating COVID-19 updates to the community, staff is reviewing the analytics, email comments and general feedback about the frequency and email lists for news on the Coronavirus. - L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) confirms 43 new deaths and 2,741 new cases of COVID-19. Of the 43 new deaths reported today, five people who passed away were over the age of 80, 16 people who died were between the ages of 65 and 79, 14 people who died were between the ages of 50 and 64, and four people who died were between the ages of 30 and 49. Four deaths were reported by the City of Long Beach. To date, Public Health identified 1,412,240 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 25,364 deaths. There are 1,673 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized, a decrease of 58 people over the past week. Testing results are available for nearly 8,164,000 individuals with 16% of people testing positive. Today's test positivity rate is 2.9%, a slight increase from last week's same-day rate of 2.7%. With increased routine screening testing, Public Health anticipates case numbers may increase again.
