# SB 1383 STATEWIDE GOALS

- State of CA goals are met through SBI383 programs & enforcement
- *Cities are not assigned a percentage or tonnage amount to reduce*

2020	<b>50% REDUCTION IN LANDFILLED ORGANIC WASTE</b> (11.5 Million Tons Allowed Organic Waste Disposal)
2022	<b>REGULATIONS TAKE EFFECT</b>
2025	<b>75% REDUCTION IN LANDFILLED ORGANIC WASTE</b> (5.7 Million Tons Allowed Organic Waste Disposal)
2025	<b>20% RECOVERY OF CURRENTLY DISPOSED EDIBLE FOOD FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION</b>

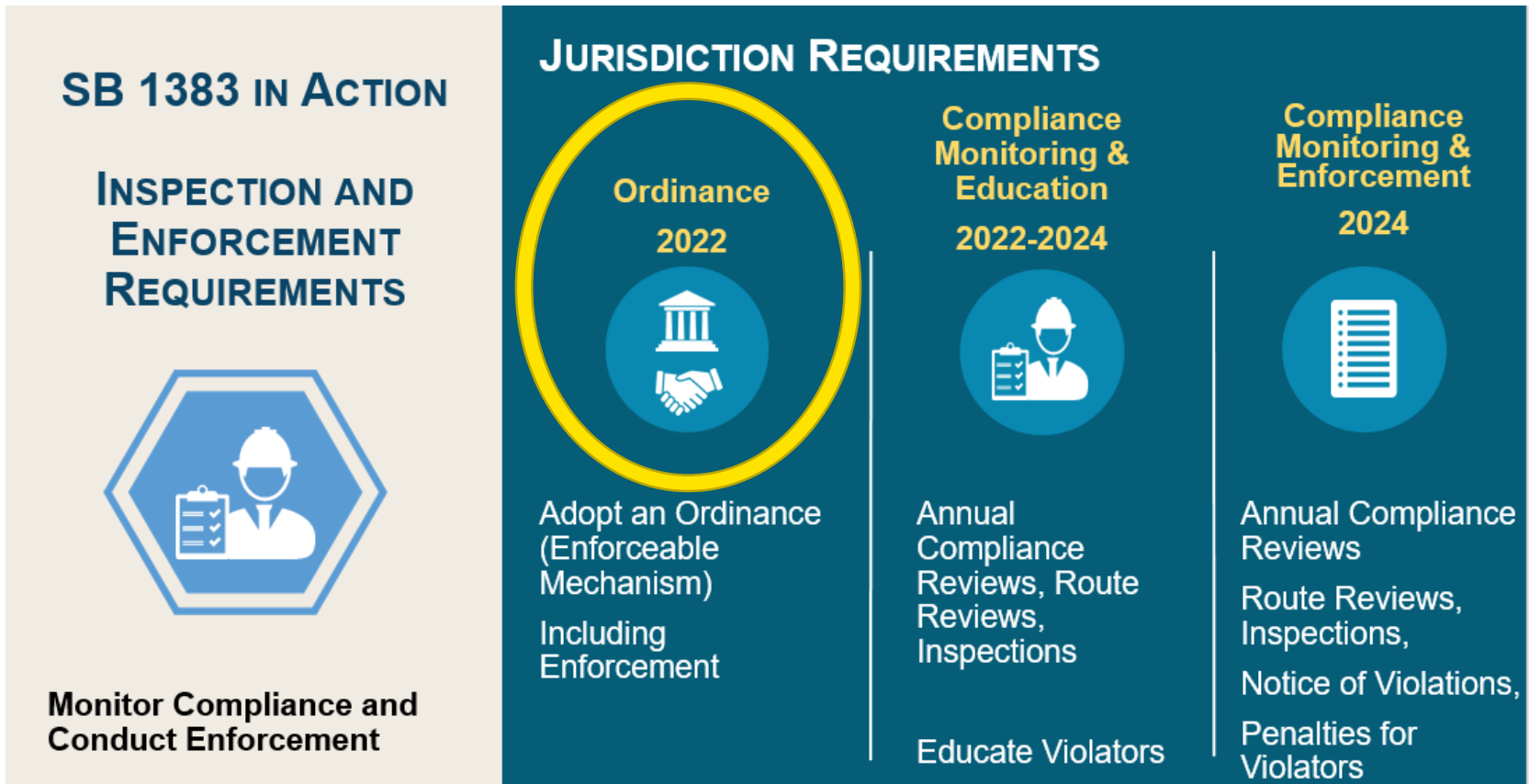

2022 – 2024 City will complete full compliance of ordinance

ORDINANCE HIGHLIGHT	RESPONSIBLE PARTY	STATUS
Organic Waste Product Procurement	City	City is compliant with recycled paper procurement. City to update Purchasing policy when receive Cal Recycle target.
Monitoring, Inspections & Reporting	City and WM	City is compliant – in franchise agreement
Compliance & Enforcement	City and WM	City – focus on “educational enforcement” from 2022-2024 WM - Contamination enforcement
Education & Outreach	City and WM	City and Hauler – organics recycling Hauler – franchise agreement required hours (400 hours annually)
Compliance with Prior State Legislation	City	City reports solid waste activities annually through the Annual Electronic Report
