COVID-19 Situation Report

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- **Boosters are Available for Eligible Individuals for All Three FDA-Approved Vaccines** (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson) - Residents who received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine should get a booster at least two months after their first dose. Residents who received the second of a two-dose Pfizer or Moderna series at least 6 months ago are also eligible for a booster dose if they are:
 - 65 years and older
 - Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings
 - Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions
 - Age 18+ who work or live in high-risk settingsFor more information, see [press release](#).
- **Public Health Prepares to Administer COVID-19 Vaccine to Children Ages 5 to 11** - In the next few days, the FDA will consider its committee's advice and make a decision whether to issue an emergency use authorization for the Pfizer vaccine for children 5 to 11 years old. Then, on November 2 and 3, the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices is expected to meet and vote on their recommendation, and shortly thereafter, the CDC Director will make a recommendation on how to use the vaccine in children. Once this recommendation is issued, vaccine providers nationwide will implement the authorization which could happen as early as November 3. For more information, see [press release](#).
- **Guidance for Families and Individuals to Have a Spooky and COVID-SAFE Halloween** - When planning your Halloween activities, think about your and your family's level of risk and remember where COVID-19 spreads more easily:
 - Closed spaces with poor air flow
 - Crowded places with many people nearby
 - Close contact settings especially where people are talking, laughing, screaming, or breathing heavily close together.For more information, visit [LA County's website](#).
- **L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19** - Public Health confirms 20 new deaths and 1,887 new cases of COVID-19. The higher number of cases today likely reflects delays in reporting of about 500 positive tests from one or more labs over the past several days. Of the 20 new

deaths reported today, three people who passed away were over the age of 80, five people who died were between the ages of 65 and 79, seven people who died were between the ages of 50 and 64, three people who died were between the ages of 30 and 49, and one person who died was between the ages of 18 and 29. One death was reported by the City of Long Beach. Public Health has identified 1,489,380 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 26,598 deaths. There are 649 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized and 28% of these people are in the ICU. Testing results are available for nearly 9,021,000 individuals with 15% of people testing positive.
