## COVID-19 Situation Report

NOVEMBER 4, 2021

### CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- **LA County Department of Public Health to Lift Mask Mandate at Events and Indoor Establishments** – LA County Department of Public Health has provided the framework for lifting masking requirements at events and indoor establishments.
  - For outdoor mega events involving more than 10,000 people, Public Health outlined that before masking requirements are lifted, all of the following criteria need to be met: LA County case rates must demonstrate three consecutive weeks at or below moderate transmission as defined by the CDC – that is less than 50 new weekly cases per 100,00 residents; hospitalizations remain low and stable at or below 600 daily COVID hospitalizations for three consecutive weeks; 80% or more of county residents 12 and older are fully vaccinated; and there are no emerging reports of significantly circulating new variants of concern that threaten vaccine effectiveness.
  - For masking requirements to be lifted at indoor events or establishments involving fewer than 1,000 people, including indoor offices and worksites, sites must have a vaccination verification process in place, and all employees and customers must be fully vaccinated, accommodating with additional requirements those employees with approved exemptions. Additionally, LA County metrics must meet all of the same standards as for lifting masking requirements at outdoor mega events.
  - Indoor masking will remain mandatory due to federal and state requirements on public transit and transportation hubs (federal) and at TK-12 schools, childcare, and youth settings; healthcare settings; correctional facilities; homeless and emergency shelters and cooling centers; and indoor mega events involving more than 1,000 people (state).
- **Public Health Now Allowing Vaccine Providers to Administer COVID-19 Vaccine to Children Ages 5 to 11** – As of Wednesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, Los Angeles County vaccine providers are now administering Pfizer vaccine to children 5 to 11 years old after the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Director Rochelle P. Walensky affirmed the recommendation by the U.S. Food & Drug Administration to expand the emergency use authorization for the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. - **L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19** – Public Health confirms 12 new deaths and 1,829 new cases of COVID-19. The higher number of cases today reflects delays in reporting of 396 positive tests from a large testing lab from between October 18 and October 29. The County is likely to see higher numbers in future days as additional backlogged tests are included in case counts. Of the 12 new deaths reported today, four people who passed away were over the age of 80, four people who died were between the ages of 65 and 79, two people who died were between the ages of 50 and 64, and two people who died were between the ages of 30 and 49. To date, Public Health has identified 1,498,393 positive cases of COVID-19 across all

areas of LA County and a total of 26,695 deaths. There are 662 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized and 23% of these people are in the ICU. Testing results are available for nearly 9,110,000 individuals with 15% of people testing positive. Today's test positivity rate is 1.6%.
