CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Los Angeles County Encourages Parents to Vaccinate Their Children 5 to 11 Years Old The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health encourages parents to protect their children and prevent transmission of COVID-19 by getting everyone in their family vaccinated who is eligible. Now that Los Angeles County vaccine providers are administering Pfizer vaccine to children 5 to 11 years old, anyone five years and older living or working in L.A. County can get vaccinated. - Beach Cities Health District Provides Covid-19 Vaccine Clinics for Children Ages 5 to 11 Manhattan Beach Unified School District (MBUSD) is working with Beach Cities Health District
 (BCHD) to provide vaccine clinics for children 5 to 11 years old. The full schedule for Beach City

- Boosters are Available for Eligible Individuals for All Three FDA-Approved Vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson) - Residents who received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine should get a booster at least two months after their first dose. Residents who received the second of a two-dose Pfizer or Moderna series at least 6 months ago are also eligible for a booster dose if they are:
 - o 65 years and older
 - Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings
 - o Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions
 - o Age 18+ who work or live in high-risk settings

 L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 – Public Health confirms 34 new deaths and 1,497 new cases of COVID-19. Eighteen deaths in today's count were from backlogs due to the now-resolved technical problem leading to yesterday's undercount. Of the 34 new deaths reported today, 11 people who passed away were over the age of 80, 14 people who died were between the ages of 65 and 79, eight people who died were between the ages of 50 and 64, and one person who died was between the ages of 30 and 49. There are 630 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized and 26% of these people are in the ICU. Testing results are available for more than 9,190,000 individuals, with 15% of people testing positive. Today's test positivity rate is 1.2%.
