## **COVID-19 Situation Report**

**DECEMBER 9, 2021**

### **CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES**

- **Omicron, A New Variant of Concern: What Is It? What do we know? What can we do?** - A new variant called Omicron was identified in South Africa and designated a variant of concern by the World Health Organization on November 26th and by the Centers for Disease Control on November 30th. Omicron has an unusual number of mutations, more than 30 of which are in the spike protein, which is the “door key” the virus uses to enter and infect humans. This could be concerning because mutations to the spike protein could increase how contagious the virus is or if it has the ability to escape from vaccine protection. Early signs indicate that Omicron spreads quickly, as it is now the dominate strain in South Africa, where it was originally identified. To date, there are over 35 countries that have identified Omicron cases so far including within the United States, including 3 so far detected in Los Angeles County as of today. At this point in time, it appears that current antigen and PCR tests detect the variant. The most effective tool remains the vaccines, and we encourage everyone 5 and older not yet vaccinated or boosted to do so with a sense of urgency. The vaccines are effective against the Delta variant and very effective against earlier strains of the virus, which gives us hope that these same vaccines will also provide some protection against Omicron.
- **L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19** – Public Health confirmed 15 new deaths and 1,718 new cases of COVID-19. There are 667 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized, 27% of these people are in the ICU. Testing results are available for nearly 9,550,000 individuals, with 15% of people testing positive.
