## **COVID-19 Situation Report**

FEBRUARY 10, 2022

#### **C**URRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- L.A. COUNTY AND CINCINNATI PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENTS CONGRATULATE THE RAMS AND BENGALS AND ENCOURAGE SAFETY MEASURES AS RESIDENTS GATHER TO WATCH THE SUPER BOWL - Remember, COVID-19 spreads more easily in closed spaces with poor airflow, crowded indoor areas where there are many people from different households, and crowded indoor and outdoor settings where people are unmasked and chanting or shouting together. Recommendations to keep our community healthy and safe during Super Bowl:
  - If possible, gather outdoors, move the TV outside, and plan to serve food and drinks outdoors
  - If having an outdoor Super Bowl gathering isn't possible, try to improve airflow, by using fans or portable air cleaners, or running the heat or air conditioning.
  - Residents should also consider getting a rapid test as close to the start of the gathering as possible, especially when gathering people who are unvaccinated and/or are at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19.
    - Rapid tests, including over-the-counter (OTC) self-tests, provide a result in 15-30 minutes. Residents can also find a testing site in LA County at <u>https://covid19.lacounty.gov/testing/</u>
  - Wearing an upgraded mask (such as an N95, KN95, or KF94) while not eating or drinking also adds stronger protection, especially if the gathering is crowded with unvaccinated guests, people with unknown vaccine status, or people who are at higher risk of severe illness.

### • COVID-19 "PICK-UP TESTING KIT" PROGRAM EXPANDED TO 14 NEW SITES AT LA

**COUNTY LIBRARIES** - L.A. County Department of Health Services has expanded its "*Pick-up Testing Kit*" program with an additional 7,000 free COVID-19 testing kits available daily via 14 new county library sites in Los Angeles County. The "*Pick-Up Testing Kit*" program allows residents to pick up a PCR test kit, perform the test and return the completed test for processing. These test kits are not the rapid antigen tests. Residents will be notified of their test results within 24-48 hours. "*Pick-Up Testing Kits*" will be available without an appointment and until daily supplies are exhausted at designated locations. The new expansion brings the pick-up testing locations to nearly 30 sites

# TO KEEP WORKPLACES AND SCHOOLS OPEN, RESIDENTS AND WORKERS ARE ASKED TO:

- Adhere to masking requirements when indoors or at crowded outdoor spaces, regardless of vaccination status.
- Remain home when sick, isolate if positive and quarantine when in close contact.
- Residents are legally required to be isolated if they have a positive COVID-19 test result and are vaccinated. Close contacts with symptoms and unvaccinated close contacts need to be quarantined.

- L.A. COUNTY DAILY BRIEFING STATISTICS ON COVID-19 L.A. Public Health confirmed 81 additional deaths and 6,276 new cases of COVID-19. Of the 81 new deaths reported today, one person was between the ages of 18-29, five people were between the ages of 30-49, 21 were between the ages of 50-64, 21 were between the ages of 65-79, and 26 were aged 80 years or older. Of the 81 newly reported deaths, 64 had underlying health conditions. Today's positivity rate is 4.7%. There are 2,464 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized. Testing results are available for more than 11,231,200 individuals, with 22% of people testing positive.
