COVID-19 Situation Report

FEBRUARY 24, 2022

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- L.A. COUNTY MODIFIES HEALTH ORDER As COVID-19 transmission continues to decline it is anticipated that Los Angeles County will reach the Moderate Rate level of transmission by mid-March. After 7 days at this level, the Los Angeles County Health Officer will remove the indoor masking mandate for fully vaccinated persons in most indoor public places. In the interim, effective on Friday, February 25, 2022, the <u>Health</u> <u>Officer Order</u> has been updated. The update provides businesses, establishments, and venues two options to voluntarily lift the indoor mask requirement for fully vaccinated people if they meet certain requirements.
 - Option 1: allows fully vaccinated customers and fully vaccinated employees to unmask indoors with verification of proof of either full vaccination against COVID-19 or a recent negative COVID-19 test result for all customers/visitors (age 5 years or older) AND all onsite workers, prior to entry. A customers/visitors test result must have been taken within 2 days of entry if a PCR test or 1 day if an antigen test. Onsite workers who are not fully vaccinated may submit a negative COVID-19 viral test result prior to work onsite, every 3 days.
 - Option 2: allows fully vaccinated customer and visitors to unmask while indoors, while all onsite workers, including contractor remain masked. To do so, customers/visitors (age 5 years or older) must verify proof of either full vaccination against COVID-19 or a recent negative COVID-19 test result. A customer/visitor test results must have been taken within 2 days of entry if a PCR test or 1 day if an antigen test.

If a business decides to take advantage of this opportunity, they must meet the criteria for the option that they choose. Businesses may also choose to continue to require indoor masking for everyone. During this time of transition, many small businesses in Manhattan Beach may not have the resources to verify vaccination status upon entrance; therefore, masks will remain a requirement.

Until further notice, masks must be worn while visiting Manhattan Beach City Hall and City facilities in an effort to continuing reducing COVID-19 community transmission. For more information on the updating mask requirements, please visit <u>L.A. County Indoor</u>

- FREE DRIVE THRU COVID-19 TESTING The Manhattan Beach Chamber of Commerce and the City of Manhattan Beach have partnered with Health Unite and Northrop Grumman to bring a free drive-thru testing site to the South Bay community. You can pre-register online or check in on site. Health Unite is offering free PCR and antigen testing with quick results.
- VACCINE AND BOOSTER CLINIC In collaboration with the County's Public Health Department, the City will be hosting a vaccine and booster clinic on Wednesday, March 9, from 9:00 AM to Noon, at the Joslyn Community Center. The Pfizer vaccine is being offered and is available to persons ages five and up. Persons can register in advance by visiting <u>www.veritas.healthcare</u>. Manhattan Beach older adult residents who do not have access to a computer can register by calling (310) 802-5430. Walk-ins are also welcome.
- L.A. COUNTY DAILY BRIEFING STATISTICS ON COVID-19 L.A. Public Health confirmed 74 additional deaths and 1,985 new cases of COVID-19. Of the 74 new deaths reported today, three people were between the ages of 30-49, 18 were between the ages of 50-64, 23 were between the ages of 65-79, and 26 were aged 80 years or older. Of the 74 newly reported deaths, 60 had underlying health conditions. Today's positivity rate is 2.2%. There are 1,150 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized. Testing results are available for more than 11,386,400 individuals, with 22% of people testing positive.
