CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- L.A. COUNTY MODIFIES HEALTH ORDER In anticipation of LA County moving into
 medium or low risk according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
 Community Level designation this Thursday, Public Health will issue a modified Health
 Officer Order which will go into effect on Friday, March 4.
 - Under this modified order, indoor masking will be strongly recommended, but not required, for vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals, except in high-risk settings where federal and state regulations continue to require masking, including everyone using public transit and all those in emergency shelters, health care settings, correctional and detention facilities, homeless shelters, and long-term care facilities. At all sites where masking indoors is no longer mandatory, employers will be required to offer, for voluntary use, medical grade masks and respirators to employees working indoors in close contact with other workers and/or customers.

Until further notice, masks must be worn while visiting Manhattan Beach City Hall and City facilities in an effort to continuing reducing COVID-19 community transmission.

- FREE DRIVE THRU COVID-19 TESTING The Manhattan Beach Chamber of Commerce and the City of Manhattan Beach have partnered with Health Unite and Northrop Grumman to bring a free drive-thru testing site to the South Bay community. You can pre-register online or check in on site. Health Unite is offering free PCR and antigen testing with quick results.
- VACCINE AND BOOSTER CLINIC In collaboration with the County's Public Health Department, the City will be hosting a vaccine and booster clinic on Wednesday, March 9, from 9:00 AM to Noon, at the Joslyn Community Center. The Pfizer vaccine is being offered and is available to persons ages five and up. Persons can register in advance by visiting www.veritas.healthcare. Manhattan Beach older adult residents who do not have access to a computer can register by calling (310) 802-5430. Walk-ins are also welcome.

L.A. COUNTY DAILY BRIEFING STATISTICS ON COVID-19 – L.A. Public Health confirmed 59 additional deaths and 1,605 new cases of COVID-19. Today's positivity rate is 1.2%. There are 852 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized. Testing results are available for more than 11,450,000 individuals, with 22% of people testing positive.
