MANHATTAN BEACH

NUMBER OF DECLINATIONS (2021)

- 211 declinations
 - 10 were filed as PV in lieu, joined with other open cases, or referred to pre-filing diversion
 - 4 cases for further investigation
 - I involved suspect already in state prison
 - \rightarrow <u>196 declinations</u>

DEALING WITH DECLINATIONS

- Appeal process
 - SD 20-07: "The presumption of pre-plea diversion may be rebutted upon reasoned consideration of the following factors:
 - Convictions for offenses of equal or greater severity than that charged over the preceding 24 months;
 - Documented history of threats or violence towards a victim;
 - Clear evidence of an identifiable, continuing threat to another individual or other circumstance of similar gravity."
 - Requests for reconsideration based on the above criteria can be sent to the law enforcement liaison, Jorge Rodriguez (jorodriguez@da.lacounty.gov)
- Vehicle Code traffic violations
 - Certain traffic offenses such as VC 12500 and VC 14601.1(a)) can be directly filed in traffic court

ENHANCED SERVICES AT THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

- Sought and received approval for hiring a Director with a clinical psychology background to lead the Bureau of Victims Services (BVS)
 - Hired the Director: ensures that the needs of survivors were centered and that trauma informed services are provided
- Process of hiring 27 new Victim Service Representatives (17 hired)
- Sought funding from BOS to initiate a needs assessment and gap analysis.
- Community Violence Reduction (CVR) Division: embedding DA personnel (Deputy District Attorneys and DA Investigators from BOI) in at-risk communities for violence intervention and interruption

CENTRAL FILING: ELECTRONIC FILING (ECER)

- Creation of Charge Evaluation Division (central filing unit)
 - Ensures consistent filing standards throughout the County
- Electronic filing procedure (eCER)
 - 490 agencies/divisions that file cases with the LADA
 - 83% of filings officewide are submitted via eCER. Expected to be at 90% within the next month
 - LADA personnel train, register, and onboard law enforcement agencies
 - Allows electronic submissions by law enforcement and electronic discovery sharing between all parties
