## **COVID-19 Situation Report**

**MARCH 31, 2022**

### **CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES**

- ***SECOND BOOSTER DOSES AVAILABLE TO ELIGIBLE RESIDENTS AT PUBLIC HEALTH OPERATED VACCINATION SITES*** - As of March 29, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration authorized a second booster dose of either the Pfizer-BioNTech or the Moderna COVID-19 vaccines for individuals 50 years of age and older at least 4 months after they received their first booster dose. Sites administering second booster doses for those 50 years of age and older are located throughout Los Angeles County. - ***OMICRON SUB-VARIANT BA.2*** - As the highly infectious BA.2 subvariant increases in L.A. County and other parts of the world, residents should continue to follow all safety protections, especially residents and workers at elevated risk of severe illness. For the latest measurement period, the week ending March 12, 32% of all sequenced specimens in L.A. County were identified as the BA.2 subvariant, double the percentage identified for the week prior ending March 5.
- ***PUBLIC HEALTH CONTINUES TO STRONGLY RECOMMEND MASKING INDOORS IN PUBLIC SETTINGS TO PROTECT THOSE AT ELEVATED RISK*** - With updated masking guidance now in effect in L.A. County, Public Health continues to strongly recommend wearing masks indoors in public settings, particularly if you, or someone you live with, is at elevated risk of severe illness from COVID-19.
- ***L.A. COUNTY DAILY BRIEFING STATISTICS ON COVID-19*** - L.A. Public Health confirmed 16 additional deaths and 784 new cases of COVID-19. Today's positivity rate is 1.1%. There are 308 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized. Testing results are available for more than 11,689,300 individuals, with 22% of people testing positive.
