Thank you in advance for your urgent consideration.

Greetings from PETA. We understand that the city of Manhattan Beach is considering hiring a contractor to trap and kill coyotes. Please know that trapping of any kind is extraordinarily stressful for captured wildlife—also tearing wild families apart and leaving orphaned young to starve—with steel-jaw devices (including the rubber-coated variety) and snares being particularly inhumane. Desperate victims often suffer horrific injuries in their frantic attempts to escape, even chewing or twisting off their own limbs, and animals caught by their necks can suffer prolonged, agonizing deaths from suffocation. Such traps are also notoriously indiscriminate—this searchable database contains more than 500 incidents involving non-target victims including humans, companion animals, and endangered species harmed or killed by these devices. Further, this approach will not solve perceived problems with coyote populations. Environmental historian Dan Flores, who has studied coyote populations and extermination efforts extensively, explains it best in this National Geographic article: "Whenever their populations are pressured, their litter sizes go up. The normal size is five to six pups. When their populations are suppressed, their litters get up as high as 12 to 16 pups. You can reduce the numbers of coyotes in a given area by 70 percent but the next summer their population will be back to the original number."

Making areas unappealing via deterrents and curtailing of food sources will encourage coyotes to move on naturally. Area residents should be advised to feed companion animals indoors and closely supervise them when outside; and maintaining feral cat colonies should be discouraged, as this 2020 study determined that feral cats and the associated feedings are a major attractant for coyotes. Trimming vegetation away from buildings, trails, and fence lines will curtail hiding places for coyotes as well as their prey. Sonic deterrents such as YardGard®, motion-activated sprinklers, flashing lights, and outdoor radios (all available at garden stores) also work effectively to deter coyotes and prey. The Bird-X Transonic Mole ChaserTM will deter burrowing animals which are a food source for coyotes; and the presence of rodents can be further mitigated by keeping Dumpsters locked, trash and compost securely contained, and grass cut shorter. Finally, a wildlife-feeding prohibition should be strictly enforced.

This integrative approach is the only effective means of coyote control and its nonlethal nature makes it favorable to the public. May we please hear that the city of Manhattan Beach will scrap cruel and futile removal initiatives? Thank you for your time and consideration.




