SUBJECT: Selection of a Representative and Alternate for the Outdoor Dining and Business Use Task Force

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parking and Public Improvements Commission select a representative and designate an alternate to participate on the Outdoor Dining and Business Use Task Force.

BACKGROUND

On July 5, 2022, the City Council directed staff to convene a working group to support a Work Plan item on Long-Term Outdoor Dining and Business Uses on Public and Private Property, referred to herein as the "Work Plan Item". The working group is tentatively named the Outdoor Dining and Business Use Task Force, and has 15 members. The member representation is attached. Seat #2 is for a Parking and Public Improvements Commission representative. To ensure continuity, staff also requests that the PPIC designate an alternate member to attend if the selected representative is unavailable. Staff is currently reaching out to business groups for participation and will be conducting outreach to garner interest for the at-large representatives.

DISCUSSION

The Outdoor Dining and Business Use Task Force will provide a broad range of perspectives in a discussion framework around the use of public right-of-way and private property for business and parking use. The discussion framework, to be approved by the City Council, is anticipated to include policy topics such as use of public property for private uses, application

of parking requirements, residential adjacency issues, coastal access, and safety concerns, as well as regulatory and fee structures.

It is estimated that project meetings for the Work Plan Item will commence approximately in October 2022 and be monthly in frequency, and may include formation of subgroups for more narrowly-focused issues. Meetings would be facilitated by City staff.

At the July 28, 2022 Parking and Public Improvements Commission Meeting, the commissioners decided to continue to a meeting where all interested parties could be present to discuss the appointment of the representative and alternate.

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION, OUTREACH, AND COMMENT

The public has been informed of this agenda item as part of the City's standard meeting notice practices via public bulletin boards, website calendar, and social media.

CONCLUSION

Staff recommends that the Commission select a representative and designate an alternate to participate in the Outdoor Dining and Business Use Task Force.

LONG-TERM OUTDOOR DINING AND BUSINESS USES ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY

On August 24, 2021, the City Council directed staff to initiate a work plan item to study long-term outdoor dining and business uses in the public right-of-way and on private property. During the COVID-19 pandemic recovery, the City permitted businesses to use parking spaces and street areas in the public right-of-way during COVID-19 operating restrictions through Emergency Orders. The long-term effort to evaluate long-term businesses uses is intended to be comprehensive, including broad community engagement, evaluation of fiscal implications, study of alternatives, environmental review, and required permitting.
