## CITY ATTORNEY'S IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE V

Manhattan Beach prohibits all commercial cannabis activity in the City to the extent permitted by State law. Measure V, which was placed on the ballot by the City Council, would maintain the status quo by re-adopting the ordinances previously adopted by the City Council prohibiting all commercial cannabis activity in the City.

Measure V defines "commercial cannabis activity" to include the cultivation, possession, manufacture, distribution, processing, storing, laboratory testing, labeling, packaging, transportation, delivery or sale of cannabis and cannabis products, for medical, non-medical or any other purpose.

Measure V will not prohibit any commercial cannabis activity that Manhattan Beach is required by State law to permit within its jurisdiction.

A "Yes" vote re-adopts the ordinances previously adopted by the City Council prohibiting commercial cannabis activity in the City.

A "No" vote is a vote against re-adopting the ordinances previously adopted by the City Council prohibiting commercial cannabis activity in the City.
