


# **CONSTRUCTION NOTICE**

#### **Pipeline Construction – Vault Lid Installation** Herrin Avenue and 19<sup>th</sup> Street – Intermittent Closures

The Peck Reservoir Replacement Project offsite pipeline work continues with the installation of injection line vault lids. The contractor will work from the intersection on Herrin Avenue and 18<sup>th</sup> Street, through 19<sup>th</sup> Street.

## **Project Activity During Construction**

Construction signs to notify residents, drivers, pedestrians and cyclists of construction activity and parking restrictions.

- Temporary closure of the intersection at 19<sup>th</sup> Street/Herrin Avenue during work hours – driveway access available at all times with flagmen to assist
- Installation of underground piping and vault lids on 19<sup>th</sup> Street
- Temporary parking restrictions and street closure in and around work area during work hours
- Delivery of material and use of heavy equipment pipe material, backhoe, delivery trucks

#### Impacts

- No through-traffic 19<sup>th</sup> Street (local access will be provided to residents on 19<sup>th</sup> Street with flagmen to assist)
- Intermittent truck activity on Herrin Avenue, 19th Street and Redondo Avenue during work hours
- Immediate work area will be cordoned off
- Intersection and through-traffic will have access to 19<sup>th</sup> Street and Herrin Avenue before and after work hours

The new Peck Reservoir will increase its capacity to eight million gallons and include new state-of-the-art filtration and other equipment to serve the Manhattan Beach community for the next 75 years and help ensure the long-term dependability of the water system in the community.
