Dear Ms. Stewart,

It is with great pleasure that I submit *Rebuilding the Legacy* for consideration for permanent installation at historic Bruce's Beach Park in Manhattan Beach, California. Since 2019, I have designed numerous bronze sculptures of similar scope for permanent installation, working with cities across the Midwest and the East Coast to create art that recognizes and celebrates black people and their contributions to this nation.

Past projects highlighted in this application include *Ernest Burke Statue* (former Negro League baseball player, Havre De Grace, MD) and *Viola Liuzzo Memorial* (Civil Rights Activist, Detroit, MI). Both of these commissioned works have required similar community participation and feedback processes before the design is unveiled for public consumption. I look forward to the opportunity to work with the City of Manhattan Beach in a similar vein to create a monument that is significant and long-lasting.

For me, sculpture is life itself and I see this opportunity at Bruce's Beach as one of great importance, a chance to commemorate and continue a safe haven for black people for many generations to come. The design for this project, as with many of my works, is meant to invoke a sense of calm and serenity for the onlooker. The black family unit, sitting together overlooking the ocean, represents a facet of American culture with impacts as vast as the sea beyond.

My pieces manufactured for permanent outdoor installation are done so using an acrylic bronze patina such that long-term maintenance costs are very low. The sculpture will only require washing and cleaning with soap and water at least once a year. Whenever possible, please contact me should any repairs be needed as I am available for consultation and restoration of my work. The sturdy design, however, is not likely to sustain many types of damage besides any potential vandalism, in which case soap and water or any mild paint stripper can be used for removal of graffiti.

Thank you for reviewing my application and the opportunity to see this vision come to life.

Additional Description of Proposal

My bronze sculpture depicts a black family at peace on a beach, symbolizing their journey of rebuilding and reclaiming their legacy. The sculpture captures a moment of tranquility and unity, as the family members are seen engaging with one another in harmonious moments of relaxation and connection. The figures in the sculpture exude a sense of contentment and serenity, basking in the warmth of the sun and the soothing sounds of crashing waves.

The artwork serves as a powerful representation of the resilience and strength of the black community, highlighting their ability to find solace and peace despite facing historical and ongoing challenges, at Bruce's Beach and beyond. The use of bronze as the medium for this sculpture adds depth and endurance to its message since bronze, a copper alloy, is known for its durability and resistance to atmospheric corrosion. Its ability to withstand the test of time reflects the enduring spirit of black families and their determination to rebuild and preserve their legacy.
