CULTURAL ARTS COMMISSION: MURAL ARTWORK SUBMISSIONS

NOVEMBER 21, 2023



BACKGROUND

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City issued an RFP for murals at seven locations.

Over 115 proposals received, Cultural Arts Commission reviewed 100.

CAC recommended 27 proposals for consideration by City Council at the September 19 meeting.

City Council selected artists for 5 locations asking that Armelle Vervialle Ngo develop a more precise rendering for Location 1, Manhattan Heights.

City Council directed staff to return to the Cultural Arts Commission to select new submissions from existing application pool for the Manhattan Beach Art Center (Location 2) and the PD/Fire Station (Location 6) wall, as well as to bring back the shark submission by Eric Snyder.

Any artist who had submitted a proposal for either Location 2 or 6 but whose submission had not been reviewed by the City Council on September 19, 2023 was invited to adjust their submission.

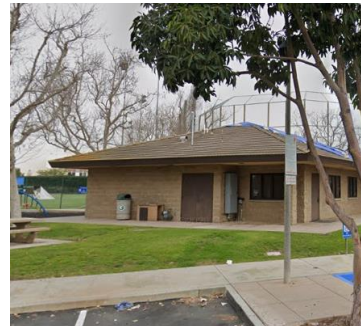

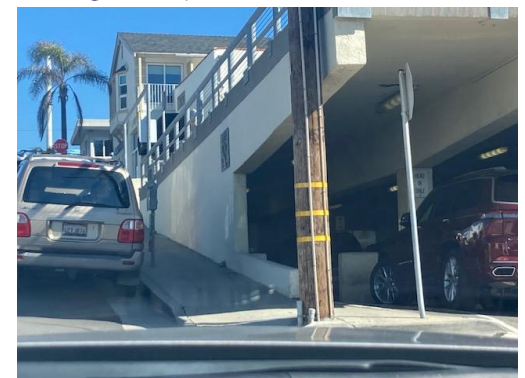
