






South Coast AQMD's Rule 1180 and 1180.1

On January 5, 2024, the South Coast AQMD Governing Board voted to amend Rule 1180 – Fenceline and Community Air Monitoring for Petroleum Refineries and Related Facilities, and adopt Rule 1180.1 – Fenceline and Community Air Monitoring for Other Refineries. These rules will require refineries and facilities with operations related to refineries, many of which are located near South Bay Communities, to monitor certain air pollutants at or near their fenceline. 


