TASK FORCE RESPONSES

Live outdoor entertainment or amplified music on private and public property

1. Do we want to allow both live outdoor entertainment and amplified music on public and private property?
 - **Yes** to both on private and public property
 - **Private property**: With agreed upon noise levels
 - **Public property**: With permit for special events
 - **Amplified music**: Yes, if attached to business and fenced in
 - **Live entertainment**: Prohibited unless permit is issued for special events

Live outdoor entertainment or amplified music on private and public property

2. What would be an appropriate timeframe to allow such activity?

- Sun – Thurs: 11am - 9 pm / Fri – Sat: Noon - 10 pm
- Until 9:30pm on any night for public property
- Match the Task Force-recommended outdoor dining operating hours of 10pm

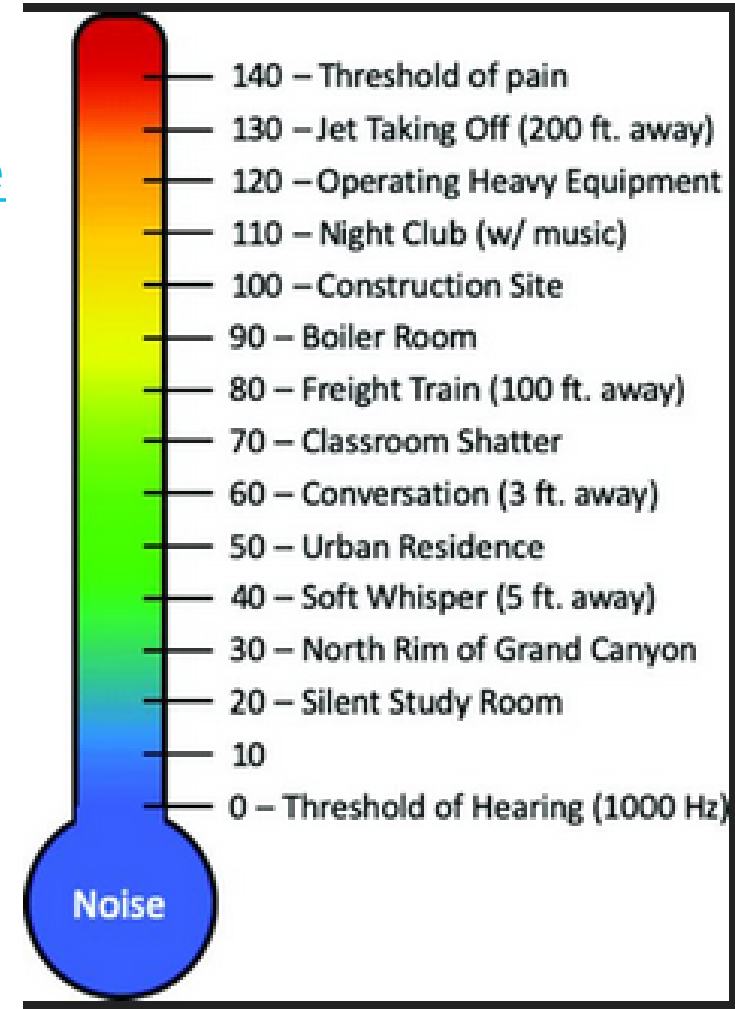


TASK FORCE RESPONSES

Live outdoor entertainment or amplified music on private and public property

3. What limitations/conditions should we impose as part of the permit?

- Noise/sound level not to exceed 60 -70 dBA



TASK FORCE RESPONSES

Live outdoor entertainment or amplified music on private and public property

3. What limitations/conditions should we impose as part of the permit?

- Amplified music only allowed when attached to the establishment and fenced in
- Limit the number of speakers per sqft and have them face the restaurant; not towards the street
- Live entertainment prohibited in congested pedestrian areas and must be 150ft from residential uses



TASK FORCE RESPONSES

Live outdoor entertainment or amplified music on private and public property

3. What limitations/conditions should we impose as part of the permit?
- Separate rules for private vs. public space and restaurants vs bars
 - Limited live entertainment on sidewalk dining areas
 - Live entertainment permits on public property should be revocable
 - Standards should not be limited to dBA and distance of measurement



TASK FORCE RESPONSES

Live outdoor entertainment or amplified music on private and public property

3. What limitations/conditions should we impose as part of the permit?

- There must be monitoring and consequences
 - Business exceeding the dBA level more than 2 times will have their permit revoked for one year
 - If a business were to offer live entertainment without a permit, their amplified music permit will be revoked
 - Revoke permit after 2 violations in a given year without ability to reapply for 2 years

TASK FORCE DISCUSSIONS

Trash

Occupancy increase >> additional refuse and waste management services

- Review of additional areas for adequate trash enclosures and service levels will be required
- Consider porter service for proper upkeep of right-of-way improvements
