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SUBJECT: Review of Proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025 through 2028-2029

Five-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Plan

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parking and Public Improvements Commission (PPIC) review the proposed projects in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025 through 2028-2029 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Plan and provide any comments on the approved project list that will be forwarded to the City Council at its upcoming Budget meetings in May 2024.

BACKGROUND

One of the City's primary functions is to ensure well-maintained facilities and physical infrastructure to meet the current and future needs of the community it serves. This is achieved by planning for and implementing a CIP Plan to address physical assets throughout the City, including but not limited to, streets and other rights-of-way facilities, water and sewer infrastructure, public buildings, parks and open space, and community amenities.

Commensurate with the budget adoption cycle, Public Works staff initiates a review of the City's proposed Five-Year CIP Plan and recommends additions and adjustments based on changing priorities, funding availability, and updated information. This report includes an extensive summary of the proposed CIP Plan for FY 2024-2025 through 2028-2029.

Projects are grouped by funding sources and include prior, current, and future funding allocations.

The proposed Five-Year CIP Plan consists of projects totaling \$210,153,801. In this year's annual revision, staff focused on improving the City's security network, continuing implementation of projects that ensure compliance with stormwater quality regulations, upgrades to parks, parking structures, facilities, and recreational facilities, improving infrastructure that supports maximizing utilization of the City's groundwater supply, and continuing with citywide transportation improvements.

This proposed FY 2024-2025 through 2028-2029 Five-Year CIP Plan will be reviewed by City Council in May 2024 prior to its final adoption in June 2024. Any comments and suggestions provided by the PPIC on the proposed project list will be conveyed to the City Council.

DISCUSSION

The proposed Five-Year CIP Plan consists of 97 projects totaling \$210,153,801. This includes projects already underway as well as those to be initiated within the next five years. Of the planned expenditures, approximately \$82.2 million are for projects approved in prior years, and the remaining \$127.9 million represents projects planned for implementation in FY 2024-2025 through 2028-2029. Collectively, the proposed Five-Year CIP Plan budget is comprised of:

\$24.6 Million	Building, Park, Facilities, Air Quality (CIP)
\$49.1 Million	Streets, Sidewalks and Other Rights-of-Way Projects (ROW)
\$6.5Million	Parking Lot Projects
\$7.2 Million	Grant Funded Projects
\$26.7 Million	Sewer Infrastructure Projects
\$37.8 Million	Water Infrastructure Projects
\$506,000	State Pier and Lot Projects
\$37.5 Million	Storm Drain Infrastructure Projects
\$19.8 Million	UUAD Projects
\$500,000	Street Lighting & Landscape Projects
