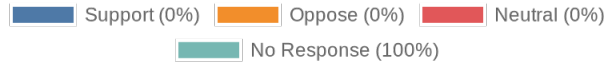

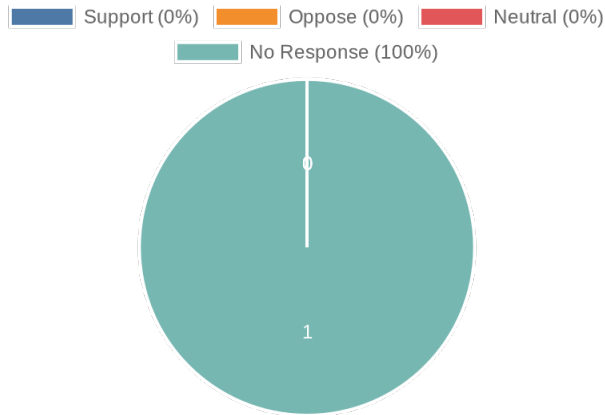

**Sand Dune Park South Lawn Improvements**

As resident living close to Sand Dune park I love this little park. Yes, some improvements are needed, the bathrooms need remodeling and the buildings need a safer construction.

However, the grass area between 33rd and 29th Streets, should stay as an open daytime area for children to play without the possibility of being hit by a regular cyclist or e-biker. I often see groups of e-bike riders riding through the park on the "pedestrian only walkways". Adding a concrete pathway will only encourage more riders to complete the "park loop" on repeat

If the proposed path is meant as a "friendly surface" to travel by bike from 29th Street and Bell to 33rd Street and Bell these travelers can cut East on 29th, North on Blanche and West on 33rd to the same location.

Extra lighting will disrupt the wildlife that we have in the park. We do not need to attract more after dark visitors to the park by "lighting their way".
