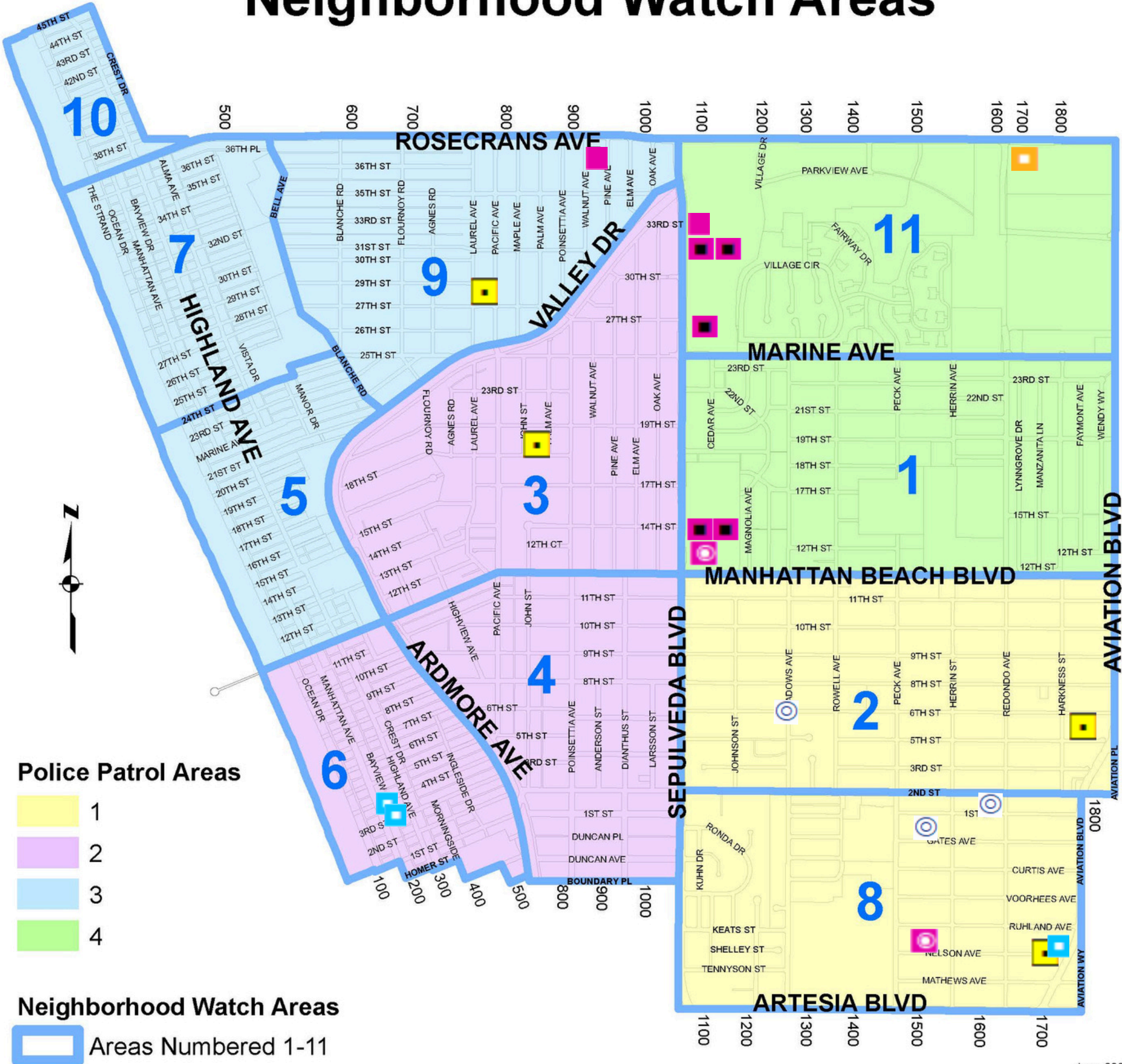

NOTABLE EVENTS

- Between 10/30/24 and 10/31/24 and the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m., a vehicle burglary occurred in the 1700 block of Nelson Avenue. Construction workers, who were working at a residence, lost keys to a van at the site. They left the vehicle parked overnight and when they returned in the morning, the vehicle had been ransacked. The suspect(s) stole tools and electronics from the van and tools from the construction site.
- On 10/31/24 between 1:00 p.m., and 2:00 p.m., a commercial burglary occurred in the 1500 block of Rosecrans Avenue (24 hour fitness). The victim placed their personal belongings including their wallet inside of a locker in the locker room and locked it. When they returned from working out, the victim discovered their lock was removed and all of his personal belongings were stolen. The victim later discovered several fraudulent charges to their credit card.
- On 11/1/24 at approximately 2:28 p.m., a residential burglary occurred in the 300 block of Bayview Dr. Officers attempted to conduct a traffic stop for vehicle violations on the suspect vehicle, when the driver of the vehicle refused to stop and evaded police. Officers pursued the vehicle into a nearby jurisdiction where the suspects were eventually arrested. A safe was found in the back seat of the suspect vehicle. Both suspects were wanted in connection for other residential burglaries.

> On 11/3/24, between 4:30 p.m., and 6:00 p.m., in the 300 block of Bayview Dr., the victim left their residence and told officers they locked the front door. When the victim returned, they found the front door unlocked. The victim entered their residence and discovered their safe was stolen. A witness in the area told officers, they saw a black SUV in front of the location at approximately 10:00 a.m.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

The MBPD wants to give the following tips to prevent everyone from becoming a victim of residential burglaries:

- Lock your residences and double check you have locked your residences before leaving.
- If you are only leaving for a short time, do not leave your garages or doors open/unlocked to your residence.
- Install a video surveillance system you can use and are familiar with.
- If you will be leaving for an extended vacation, please have your neighbors collect any mail or packages.
- Do not advertise on social media before or while you are on vacation.
- You can notify the MBPD if you will be on vacation so the officers are aware of residences that will remain vacant for extended periods of time.
- Do not leave ladders or lawn furniture that is easy to manipulate and used to climb onto second story ledges or balconies.
- Lock all side gates.
