Subcommittee Liaison presentations of mission statement

- a. Climate Action: The Subcommittee will develop recommendations that will enable the City to reduce greenhouse gas emissions at least 7% below 1990 levels and incorporate a community-wide emissions education campaign.
- b. Green Building: To identify environmentally responsible, sustainable and energy efficient policies for constructing, renovating and occupying the built environment; To develop and make recommendations to City Council that will lead towards a healthy and sustainable city; and To educate and promote programs that increase awareness and incentivize sustainable building practices.

- c. Solid Waste: The Solid Waste and Recycling Subcommittee will act as liaisons for the community to come up with the most effective, comprehensive, and innovative waste reduction and recycling program possible and make recommendations to City Council.
- d. Water and Storm Water: To support the City's effort to work toward a greater, greener Manhattan Beach by providing policy recommendations to the Environmental Task Force and City Council on stewardship of our limited water resources and effective storm water management to protect our beaches and coastal waters.
